synopsis

Wild Nova Scotia is a television show that sweeps the viewer deep into the rich natural world of our last great forests, stunning coastal treasures and rare species habitats exploring the secrets of each unique ecosystem thriving right here in Nova Scotia.

Nova Scotia land conservation is a tremendous success story. These lands have been protected for all time, for your great grandchildren and for mine, but we don't know much about them. This show celebrates and educates the audience about our natural riches and why they have been protected.

Each half hour episode will take the viewer to one of Nova Scotia's many of protected wild spaces on some of the 14,000 protected acres from Yarmouth to Cape Breton. Hosted by Zoe D'Amato, the audience will also meet different ecologists, biologists, conservation experts and land stewards who will explore why the wild space needed to be protected.

From rare plants, to birds, to animals, to rare ecosystems, we have incredible natural heritage to be proud of.

Imagine an episode where we visit the beautiful mountains of Cape Breton and learn about the importance of protecting such a gems. It's a little more obvious why we have to protect some our coastal habitats but we'll learn about why rivers and the land alongside them are essential corridors for the birds, plants and animals that live within these ecosystems.

One of the most exciting episodes will be spent exploring Bon Portage Island where we'll learn about incredible birds who nest underground and who are related to the albatross.

Other episodes will feature places that are important bird habitat, endangered species habitat, urban wild lands, and our last great forests. There will be a great variety of environments and visuals.

Although the show is meant to educate, it's also meant to excite the audience by sharing secrets about our natural environments that have been right in front of us, hidden in plain sight all along and foster a love wild spaces.

During this time of pandemic people have found themselves drawn to the beauty of nature and realizing more than ever, the power Wild places have. Part science, part sacred, the power of nature unites us all.

The Nova Scotia Nature Trust is one of the leading land trusts in North America and is the subject matter expert on this project.
